## **European Voluntary Service in IFM-SEI member organisations**

Would you like to get new experiences and volunteer in a like-minded child and youth organisation in another country? With the European Voluntary Service project of the International Falcon Movement-Socialist Educational International this is possible!

### **Doing a 'European Voluntary Service' (EVS) with IFM-SEI means:**

Living for 6 to 12 months in another country

- Working in a child and youth organisation together with local volunteers
- Discovering the host country together with other EVS volunteers or local volunteers
- Gaining intercultural experience and learning the language of your host country
- Being in contact with a global group of IFM-SEI volunteers through sharing of experiences online

The theme of the EVS project will be '**Outdoor education as a tool for inclusion and meaningful participation.**' All our organisations run outdoor educational activities and as a volunteer you will contribute to this area of work by planning and running activities with children's groups. You will also spend time supporting the work of your host organisation. This will be different in each organisation, but can include:

- Helping in the office (planning activities, running seminars, helping with design and publications etc.)
- Working in a youth centre
- Teaching your language to local children
- Supporting local volunteers to set up new groups

Detailed information about each organisation is at the end of this document.

The EVS programme is financed by the European Commission. The grant covers:

- Accommodation in a single room in a shared flat
- Allowance for food and local transport
- A language course
- Pocket money
- Health insurance
- Travel costs to and from the host country
- Visa and vaccination costs up to a maximum amount

Your sending organisation (your home falcon organisation) will support you with the preparation of your stay.

- Your preferred starting and ending date (The starting date can be between 1<sup>st</sup> April and 1<sup>st</sup> July 2013, and your service period can be between 6 and 12 months)

- Aged between 18 and 30
- Able to communicate in English (or in the language of the host country; In the Spanish and French speaking host organisations a basic level of Spanish or French is recommended)
- Able to commit 6 months - a year to volunteering in another country

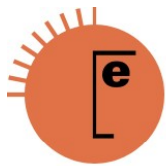

**esplac**  
Esplais Catalans

### **Esplac, Barcelona - Spain** ----- -----

**Esplais Catalans**, Esplac, is an association of 98 secular (committed to the promotion of critical thinking and freedom of conscience) and progressive youth centres working from voluntary youth work to achieve Social Transformation by using Children Rights Education as a tool. The empowerment of our voluntary-based youth centres is our reason to exist. The six following values guide our actions: education, secularity, volunteering, associationism, internationalism and friendship.

Esplac is composed of 6500 children and teenagers and 1600 voluntary youth leaders. Esplac is member of IFM-SEI and FIEEA international federations.

### **Work areas of the Volunteers:**

- Visit esplais (youth centres) to support them in running projects
- Run activities with children as educator of an esplai (youth centre): these activities take place on Saturday afternoon and usually, once a month, there is an excursion to the nature.
- Support Esplac officers in project work (helping with design and layout, organising youth exchanges, child rights activities, video projects, general assembly of Esplac)
- Participate in Commissions (for example International Commission, Reducing foot-print Commission or Pedagogical Commission) Their meetings take place once a month.

### **KKSP, Medan – Indonesia** ----- -----



**KKSP** was established in 1987 focussing on the protection, fulfilment and promotion of human rights through running an education and information centre for children's rights. The main goals of KKSP are to support young people with their basic needs: survival, development, protection and participation. KKSP aims to provide protection for children from exploitation, violence and violations of their rights.

Their main activities include providing alternative education for street children using both street and centre based approaches, peer education to prevent children from being trafficked and the promotion of child rights through advocacy and capacity building. KKSP has developed programmes on conflict resolution for peers and street children and child participation in child rights issues. Additionally, KKSP works with children in armed conflicts, supporting them in their transition to non-conflict situations.

- Supporting KKSP staff and volunteers in field work with street children
- Supporting KKSP staff and volunteers in field work on child trafficking or child labour
- Field work for creative education in villages
- Learning about child labour in Indonesia and the situation of children and young people
- Activities with children on South-East Asian issues regarding children's rights
- Learning about Indonesian culture and language
- Teaching English to local children

  1. Venturer Camp 2013 (camp run by and for about 900 young people aged 13 – 15)
  2. NCS Youth Festival 2013 & 14 (programme for 16 and 17 year olds running for 3 weeks in the summer combining outdoor activities and local community projects)

#### **Including:**

- Event promotion
- Event bookings
- Supporting the co-ordination of event programme
- Evaluating the events from a young person's perspective
- Following the summer 2013 camps, the volunteers would begin to support member volunteers to make preparation for future camps and record lessons learnt – interviewing participants and volunteers.

## Liepajas Jaunie Vanagi, Liepajas - Latvia -----



The child and youth union "Liepajas Jaunie Vanagi" (Liepajas Young Falcons) was founded in 1993. Members are between 5 and 30 years old and are mostly young people with fewer opportunities – most of them come from low income families. Our aim is the promotion and protection of rights and interests of children and the encouragement of active and creative youth development.

Liepajas Jaunie Vanagi supports young people in taking initiative and realising their ideas. Together with the different age groups we organise international meetings, sport days, camps, educational activities etc.

We want that young people become empowered to become active in the society, to spend their leisure time as funny and productive as possible, to have an international spirit and to be aware that children have the right to take decisions. [www.liepajasjv.lv](http://www.liepajasjv.lv)

### **Work areas of the Volunteers:**

- Support volunteers in planning and organisation of local activities, youth initiatives, camps, outdoor activities and an international seminar

- Support the work of ParticipACTION, working with local councils and schools to involve children in decision-making.
- Practical work with children and young people in our youth centre, after school activities for children, discussions, games, movie nights, art, music and language workshops, work with disabled children etc.
- Prepare a youth exchange or youth initiative in cooperation with the sending organisation of the volunteers
- Visiting schools to inform about the EVS
- Meeting with other NGOs based in Liepajas, Working in the municipality, in children houses or hospitals to better understand how a Latvian community is functioning.

## ACACIA, Bogota - Colombia - - - - -



**Acacia, Colombia** is a national children's and youth organisation, promoting children's rights. They work in both non-formal and formal education settings, having established partnerships with schools to ensure the effective spread of information about children's rights. They introduce non-formal and peer education approaches to the rights of the child in the classroom, empowering young people as important actors on this topic. In addition, Acacia organises after-school activities led by young people in disadvantaged areas. An example of a project recently carried out is the creation of a community library and youth centre by young people in the neighbourhood of Santa Cecilia in Bogota.

Young people were motivated to offer an alternative in the community to fight back against crime and the gang culture and were supported by Acacia to ensure this became reality. They also run non-formal education activities on youth leadership, empowering young people to take an active role as citizens in their communities.

### **Work areas of the Volunteers:**

- Youth participation activities at 'Casa de Atencion Integral' (organising workshops on different topics according to the interests of the volunteer and the young people, supporting networks etc.)
- Organising a camp in co-operation with local volunteers
- Supporting the office of the Latin American Youth Forum 'FLAJ' in coordination, networking, organising meetings etc.
- Giving language classes to children and young people with fewer opportunities in the Library Santa Cecilia
- Learning Spanish
- Maintaining the relationship established by the current volunteer with the community, it helps to bring the community closer to Acacia. A good relationship is necessary to help our organisation to develop our projects with them.
- Ensuring continuity and feedback between the 2012 and 2013 EVS projects, volunteers of 2012 EVS project will organise at least three workshops along with the volunteers of 2013 EVS project to share experiences ideas and some hints.

## Action Enfance, Dakar - Senegal - - - - -



Action Enfance is a social and educational movement working for the recognition of the role and rights of the child, in a spirit of secularism but based on the principles of equality, solidarity and democracy. It aims to promote the rights of the child, to assist underprivileged and deprived children, provide leisure time activities and help children and young people in taking care of themselves and their surroundings.

We conduct advocacy, empowerment sessions, intercultural exchanges, camps and weekly meetings. We are members of the IFM-SEI, the National Youth Council of Senegal, the National Committee of the Child and the Senegalese Children's parliament. We offer formal education in an associative school and informal education through peer education and the promotion of the rights of the child. Supervision is provided by a team of monitors and teachers in the educational centers. Hundreds of younger and older people volunteer in our structures and in school clubs. Sustainable development education is our priority at the moment and the daily witnessing of the acute environmental problems in the area where our organisation is settled is a source of motivation to work on this theme. We are also actively working to stop mendicancy of children and will run a Human Rights Education project in 2012.

### Work areas of the Volunteers:

- Organise non-formal education activities together with volunteers, especially on environmental protection and human rights education
- Teach English/ other languages/ subjects they are interested in
- Support the women's committee on women's rights issues
- Work in a day-care centre for street children
- Organise projects on environmental issues and work in the educational garden of Action Enfance
- Learn Wolof and French

## OGCEYOD, Limbe – Cameroon - - - - -



OGCEYOD (Organisation for Gender, Civic Engagement and Youth Development) Cameroon focuses on Education and Research with its target groups; Youth and Women. It has as its main aim: to invest directly in young people's education, health and social protection by creating incentives for young people to become educated, productive and healthy and to take part in poverty reduction strategies.

Other objectives include the promotion of education through eliminating school fees, providing incentives to retain children and young people in school, monitoring access and retention of children and young people to basic education and promoting quality education. We develop relevant, context-specific and gender-sensitive educational programmes, including vocational training for out-of-school young people, health awareness programmes and sustainable development education. We promote the full participation of young people in local, national and international decision-making processes and involve them in the development of policies and programmes. <http://www.ogceyodcameroon.webs.com>

## **Work areas of the Volunteer:**

### **OGCEYOD Falcons**

Providing alternative after-school activities for a regular weekly group for children aged 8-12 in the region of Limbe. The activities can include:

- Cooperative games and activities
- Workshops on human rights, women's rights and children's rights
- Craft activities
- Environmental issues
- HIV/ AIDS education
- Singing, story-telling, dancing and theatre
- Gender and sexuality education
- Relationships and respect

### **In Between Project**

A youth journalism project to offer information and activities for young people which are attractive to them. The 'In Between' magazine is written by students for their peers. It serves as a platform of exchange by bringing together many individual contributions. The volunteers can:

- Meet regularly with the young journalists, plan the magazine, offer training and support
- Recruit and motivate new journalists
- Support the team in distributing the magazine

### **Healthy Campus**

Many health problems of children in Cameroon are caused by the low hygiene and sanitary standards in school kitchens. Together with local volunteers and the municipality, the volunteers will:

- Offer training and support to the school cooks on health and sanitary issues
- Give tips how to cook nutritious and delicious food
- Organise workshops with pupils to raise their awareness on hygiene, sanitation and environment.

## **Antar Bharati, India** - - - - -



Antar Bharati is an organisation whose task is to defend the rights of the child. We aim to provide for the survival and development of children everywhere, protect them from harm and exploitation and enable them to participate in decisions directly affecting their lives to build the foundation of a just society that we all want and which children deserve.

Our aim is to inculcate, promote and develop a spirit of mutual friendship, fraternity and unity among the people of different states of the Indian Republic. Our final objective is International friendship— solidarity with the people of the world.

Here is our challenge: “How can we in a world of oppression, dictatorship, unemployment, hunger and arms race in many places of the world educate our children and young people in a spirit of democracy, socialism, freedom, justice and solidarity?” To meet this challenge we organise national integration and environment protection camps, children’s carnivals, youth camps, seminars on problems affecting children and young people, projects in schools, a micro-finance bank for women. We work with street children and have a children hospital.

**Work Areas of the Volunteers:**

- Participation in the camp and its organisation
- Participation in the children’s carnival and its organisation
- Volunteering at our children hospital
- Volunteering at our Special School for mentally challenged children
- Volunteering at our micro-finance bank for women entrepreneurs
- Assisting at our labour union activities
- Organising seminars and trips for the youth and many more such activities

**Mentes en Accion, Honduras NOT 100% CONFIRMED! -----**



Mentes en Accion is a youth movement based in Honduras. We organize educational activities and projects distributing materials and food to schools and communities.

**Work areas of the Volunteers:**

- Aid in designing our campaigns and our activities.
- Help at a Children’s home that we cooperate with, by helping the children with class tutoring, extra-curricular activities such as sports, arts, games among others.
- Help in distributing our donations.
- Travelling to different places outside our operational area where we have programmes taking place.

**Integridad Absoluta, Chile -----**



Integridad Absoluta is a voluntary organisation, which aims to promote the transformation of society for children, in particular those who are vulnerable. Our organisation carries out various activities and projects such as weekly activities, educational support to children, youth training, the children’s orchestra and recreational activities. **Work areas of Volunteers:**

- Educational and language support to children in the town of La Higuera and Coquimbo (490 KM North of Santiago)
- Working with a local group developing educational and sports activities with youth and children (Coquimbo).
- Supporting the preparation and implementation of the International Camp La Serena 2013.

- Helping to develop and run a campaign to promote the rights of the child
- Supporting the children's orchestra and helping with the rehearsals
- Supporting the development of projects in Integridad Absoluta
- Supporting young people in the commune of La Serena and Coquimbo to run groups
- Working with college students developing projects on environment, gender equality, leadership amongst others.
- Local management work in coordination with the local municipality (networking with rural schools in environmental education for example).

### Kinderfreunde/ Rote Falken, Austria -----



Kinderfreunde/Rote Falken was founded in 1908 and runs around 300 voluntary-led children and youth groups all over Austria. We organise workshops, seminars and games, role plays and outdoor-activities about children's rights, child labour, violence against children and other topics. The aim of Kinderfreunde is to change and shape society by education. As a member of IFM-SEI international activities are also an important part of our educational work with children and young people. Every year we are hosting international seminars and camps and we are sending people to different activities all over the world to take part in different projects.

#### Work areas of the Volunteers:

- Supporting the international office in Kinderfreunde/or one of the federal offices in their international work, supporting group exchanges, seminars and activities
- Planning and running seminars/ projects
- Working educationally with children and youth groups
- Getting involved in weekly group work
- working in Kindergartens or institutions for children of Kinderfreunde
- Helping at our summer camp in Doebriach, Carinthia

### Les Faucons Rouges and Ath Solidarity - Ath Belgium -----



The children and youth organisation **Les Faucons Rouges – Ath Belgium** was founded in 1984. Members are between 2 and 16 years old and are mostly young people from workers families – some of them come from low income families.

Our aim is to promote and protect the rights and interest of children and to encourage active and creative youth development.

Les Faucons Rouges are supporting young people in taking initiative and realising their ideas. Together with the different age groups we organise activities every Saturday afternoon. During school holidays, we organise activities for children from 2 to 12 years old in close cooperation with the ASBL - Ath Solidarity. We also organise camps during summer and Christmas period and other educational activities.

We want that young people become empowered to be active in the society, to spend their leisure time as funny and productive as possible, to have an international spirit and to be aware that children have the right to take decisions.

Ath Solidarity has two kindergartens where 16 young workers welcome more than 40 children every day.

**Work areas of the Volunteers:**

- Support Faucons Rouges volunteers in planning and organising local activities, youth initiatives, camps, in –and outdoor activities
- Practical work with children and young people in our youth centre, after school activities for children, discussions, games, movie nights, art, music and language workshops and work as volunteers in the kindergartens to animate children between 0 and 3 years old.
- Work with the local group of children and young people of Ath
- Visiting schools to inform about the EVS

**SKIF, Melbourne, Australia NOT 100% CONFIRMED! -----**



SKIF is the children’s movement of the Jewish Labour Bund Inc. and has been in existence in Melbourne for over 60 years. It aims to promote Chavershaft (friendship), Doikayt (A sense of belonging irregardless of where one lives), Democratic Socialism and Yiddishkayt (Yiddish language and culture).

Apart from running weekly activities, SKIF runs Winter, Spring and Summer Camps for children and organises a seminar program for its volunteer Helfer (Helpers).

SKIF participates in many social action campaigns including refugee rights and other related activities. Members of SKIF and older together with other organisations provide volunteer work more specifically in aboriginal communities and assist the local Sudanese refugees that have recently arrived in Melbourne.

**Lithuanian Young Falcon Union, Lithuania -----**



LYFU is a non-governmental organisation for children and young people. The organisational activities include non-formal education (seminars, camps, gatherings) on topics of equal opportunities, anti-discrimination, xenophobia, anti-racism, conflict resolution; organisation of weekly or

monthly meetings for children and youth groups; empowerment of children to express their opinions and to involve their voices in decision making processes; organisation of different activities on Children’s rights, trips for different groups, activities around the 20th November (birthday of the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child).

The main principals of the LYFU are freedom, solidarity, justice, equal opportunities for all,

social equality.

### **Work areas of the Volunteers:**

- Supporting local groups
- Working with children and young people to organise outdoor activities and excursions
- Participating in the project working with Roma children and communities
- Helping to organise the annual camp
- Helping to organise projects and seminars

### **NOV, Israel** - - - - -



**Histadrut HaNoar HaOved VeHaLomed** (*The Federation of Working and Studying Youth*) is an Israeli youth movement. The movement was founded in 1924 by young people working to defend their rights. Today, there are about 1,000 members of NOV living in small communes in cities or kibbutzim and working in Israeli Society - mostly in education and the youth movement.

The movement aims are to strive for human rights and happiness. It stands for democratic and socialist principles. NOV has Jewish, Druze and Arab members. All members are involved and active in processes of social change and their ambition is to live in a Kibbutz or in any other socialist and cooperative way of living. ### **Work areas of the Volunteers:**

- **"Shared existence"**. "Shared existence" is a slogan in our movement and also a big circle of activities. The meaning is different from co-existence: when the existence is shared, something new is created in partnership, whereas co-existence can be "cold" and passive. We have clubs all over the state in Arab cities and villages where local volunteers and members from our movement run clubs for children, teach them and do non formal activities. IFM volunteers could teach English, run activities and projects in one or more clubs. They will work with our members and go deep into the meaning of the term and how to develop other activities of "shared existence" even in other places in the world.
- **Learn Hebrew and Arabic**, learn about Israeli society and the Middle East culture and conflicts.
- **Socialist Experience**. Live next to a commune of young adults, work with some members in our branches, get to know and learn about co-operatives, the social protest in Israel - learn and take part in educational work for social justice
- **Agricultural Education**: NOV has a Kibbutz and seminar centre with orchards of mango, lichi, olives etc. The work is done by members and is combined with educational activities. Groups can come to the centre for one week to work every day from 4 in the morning until 11 in the orchard. Then they rest and have a seminar in the afternoon. The orchards are run by educators. The volunteers could take part in such a week and learn about how this concept promotes a socialist and alternative way of life.
- **Non formal education** work in one or more branches on regular basis, learn, experience and develop the concept of young leaders and the internal democracy structure in the

branches. They can take part in seminars, trips, camps and outdoor activities.

## **Nueva Generacion, Bolivia** -----

Nueva Generacion, Bolivia is a children's and youth organisation in Bolivia. We work with children to empower and educate them, supporting their development at every stage.

### **Work areas of the Volunteers:**

- In Alegria Children's Centre: (Care of children 6 months to 3 years) including :
  - Education and development
  - supporting their nutritional and health needs (basic hygiene, healthy eating etc)
  - Personal and social development
  - Stimulation of autonomy, identity, music and sports development  
(for this we offer training before and during the service)
- In the Day Care Centres (Work with children of school age) twice a week in the morning
  - Recreation: Outdoor Games, Songs, Board games
  - Children's rights: Multi-active workshops, puppets, theatre
- The Joy Vacation Club (boys and girls of school age)
  - Recreation: Outdoor games, songs, Hiking, Camping
