Mandates commission

The Congress shall appoint a Mandates Commission of 5 people to advise the Congress of the number of delegates, the nominations received and to record the elections.

Only mandated delegates shall be entitled to vote in the Congress.

Resolutions and work-plan commission

The Congress shall establish a resolutions and work-plan commission. This commission will consist of five members. The task of this commission will be to draft statements and publish resolutions initiated before and during the Congress.

In its work, the commission should consult every delegation at the Congress. It shall keep the Steering Committee of the Congress well informed about its deliberations.

Each draft from this commission will be presented to the Congress for discussion and adoption. The resolutions commission must see to it, with assistance of the Congress Presidium, that written copies of the respective statements are distributed before the matter is going to be dealt with by the Congress.

The resolutions commission will deal with the work plan proposals forwarded to the Congress, as well as those initiated during the Congress.

Preparation and Nominations commission

According to the rules of procedure for this Ordinary Congress, a Nominations commission will be established.

The Commission will consist of five members, the task of the Commission is to prepare the elections which will be executed by the Congress.

The commission will receive all information on the proposed candidates and will check whether the proposed candidates are prepared to undertake their responsibility if elected.

6.12. of the constitution states that nominations for the posts of President, a minimum of 7 and a maximum of 9 Vice-Presidents, Financial Auditors and Control Commission and Secretary General must be accompanied by a declaration from the candidates, confirming his/her willingness to take the post if elected. Only full member organisations are allowed to candidate. The Presidium will nominate a preparatory nominations commission to prepare the elections before the congress.

When electing the Nominations Commission, the Congress will inform delegates of the exact hour during the Congress when the nomination of candidates is to be considered closed.

The commission has to take note of its findings and distribute a complete list of the candidates nominated and who are willing and prepared to run as candidates. The commissions' proposals for people to be elected must be indicated on this list.

The elections which are to be prepared by the Commission, concern the following functions:

- President
- 7 up to 9 Vice Presidents
- Three organisations to nominate a member of the control commission
- Secretary General

All these functions will be elected for the next Ordinary Congress period (three years).

Participation of associated and observer organisations

Article 2.2.2 Associate members

Associate member organisations must meet the following criteria:

- a) One year as an observer.
- b) Compliance with the principles of full membership status (except 2.2.1.d)
- c) Operate at national or state level or being a local organisation that the International Committee approves for special reasons (for example a local organisation that meets the IFM-SEI's aims and work but have no possibility to act on a national or state level).

Associated members can take part in all IFM-SEI events and are kept regularly informed about the organisation. They have no voting rights in the IFM-SEI decision- making process.

By decision of the Presidium in September 2009 every associated member is entitled to send one delegate.

Article 2.2.3 Observers

Observers are organisations that wish to observe the IFM-SEI and be observed by the IFM-SEI. The International Committee must accept them.

These organisations will be invited to all IFM-SEI events. They have no voting rights in the IFM-SEI decision- making process.

After a minimum of one and a maximum of two years these organisations must decide whether to upgrade their status and apply to be a member or to end the co-operation.

By decision of the Presidium in September 2009 every observer is entitled to send one delegate.
